# Re: Blood pressure assessment in BCW Fetal Monitoring Clinic

### What is currently done?

Blood pressure is routinely measured as part of the visit for patients referred with the following conditions:

- Gestational or chronic hypertensive disorder
- Placental insufficiency: severe IUGR (also mild and moderate IUGR as of June 1st)
- PPROM (a full set of vitals is obtained)
- When indicated by nursing assessment (eg symptomatic patient)
- When requested by care provider due to the presence of a specific condition

## What is new?

In order to help support use of virtual care for obstetrical visits, fetal monitoring is now offering blood pressure measurement on any scheduled patients <u>upon care provider request</u>.

To have a BP measurement done as part of the fetal monitoring please ensure that:

- -Request for BP check is clearly indicated on the fetal monitoring referral
- -A <u>direct number or pager is provided</u> for fetal monitoring nurse to call if BP is >140/90 (please indicate on referral if a different BP threshold is requested)

#### What is the communication process?

- -Blood pressure <140/90: blood pressure measurement documented on the interprofessional notes along with NST result. This is faxed to the care provider's office at the end of the day as per routine -Blood pressure is >140/90 or above otherwise defined threshold:
- -Careprovider contacted as per requisition

#### Please note:

-If communication with care provider not reached within 20 mins, oncall provider will contacted and patient will be directed to the UCC
