Fetal Monitoring - Patient Information

We hope the following information will help prepare you for appointment and answer some of the questions you may have.

You should not be uncomfortable. Bring your Care Card and photo ID with you. Please do not wear any perfume as we are a scent free facility.

What is Fetal Monitoring, also known as Non-Stress Test (NST)?

The certified Registered Nurse who performs the Fetal Monitoring will explain everything to you. The pattern of a baby's heartbeat often reflects the baby's wellbeing. The fetal monitoring assessment provides an ongoing visual tracing of the heart rate over a period of 20 minutes or more, and may also show the contractions you are experiencing. The Nurse will evaluate the results and consult a physician if needed during the NST. Your doctor will be contacted, if necessary, and further appointments may be booked depending on the reason for your referral and the individual results.

Who may attend the visit with me? How do I cancel/rebook my appointment?

- Due to limited space and infection control precautions, support persons are not typically invited *into* the Fetal Monitoring room, but may wait in the nearby waiting room during the 30 minute appointment.
- Small children must be accompanied by an adult other than yourself.
- If you need to cancel or rebook your appointment, please contact the Fetal Monitoring clerk as soon as possible by telephone at 604-875-3100.

Where is the BC Women's Fetal Monitoring Service located?

The hospital is located at 4500 Oak Street. Once you have entered the hospital site, follow the driveway to BC Women's Hospital Main Entrance #93 (Visitors/Outpatients). Please check-in at Desk 4. (*If Entrance #93 is closed, please use Entrance #97.*)

What is ultrasound?

Ultrasound is sometimes used in conjunction with Fetal Monitoring in order to determine your baby's wellbeing and current condition.

Ultrasound is a sound wave that humans cannot hear. An ultrasound scanner sends these sound waves into your body. The sound waves are reflected back and converted into pictures on the screen. *There are no known harmful effects from ultrasound to you or your fetus (unborn baby).*

- AFI/Doppler Ultrasound (US) are limited US appointments. Full imaging of the fetus does not occur for AFI/Doppler US appointments.
- A single support person may attend this scan with you.
- Small children must be accompanied by an adult other than yourself.
- A full bladder is not required for AFI/Doppler US exams. It's important for people to be well hydrated but they should be comfortable.
